

Re: Infestation of noxious weeds on your property.

Dear Landowner:

This letter is regarding a noxious weed infestation on property owned by you. This property is in _____ Township, Section _____. On _____, _____ Township conducted weed inspections. Your property was identified as having an infestation of _____.

The Minnesota Noxious Weed law requires occupants, owners or their agents to control or eradicate noxious weeds growing on their property as found in Minnesota Statute Section 18.78.

Immediate steps are necessary to control the noxious weed growth on your property, please control under one of the following methods: 1) Cut down the noxious weed plants or pull them out of the ground; or 2) Plow down, disc, or otherwise till the land to control the noxious weeds; or 3) Use a herbicide that is labeled for the noxious weed, in compliance with label directions.

The township will be re-inspecting your property on or around _____. If by that time you have not complied with the requirement of the noxious weed law, an Individual Notice to Control or Eradicate Noxious Weeds may be issued by the _____ County Agricultural Inspector.

If you fail to comply, someone may be hired to do the control or eradication work and the cost will be assessed to your taxes by process found in Minnesota Statute Section 18.83.
